Job dimensions

Applicants should be able to teach Mathematics at the equivalence of AQF levels 4 and 5 (Foundation and Diploma programmes). You will be responsible for the development of accredited units and will work closely with management to ensure that quality and standards are maintained. You will also require the ability to teach a variety of students from a variety of countries and cultural backgrounds and different language levels. It is expected that your teaching will initially be delivered online.

Key accountabilities and duties

- To develop, teach and assess Mathematics units at Foundation and Diploma level, following unit outlines provided;
- To design purposeful and appropriate lesson plans that provide for effective teaching strategies and meet the individual needs of students;
- To prepare, select and use teaching-learning materials for international students (including the use of textbooks, in-house materials and self-created materials);
- To provide oral and written feedback to students and other stakeholders (e.g. programme managers, pastoral tutors and parents);
- To adapt it to the teaching circumstances as necessary, such as the ability to switch from in-person delivery to online delivery.

- To attend regular staff and student representative meetings.
- To set and mark both formative and summative coursework, complying to quality assurance processes as necessary and keeping reliable records of scores achieved.
- To maintain accurate records of student attendance and academic progress, and to produce periodic reports at the request of the Programme Manager.
- To work throughout the academic year with the programme manager on all aspects of unit development.
